What to Bring

- 1 bag (preferably a backpack BUT only one no exceptions and no hockey bags)
- Clothing for 3.5 days
- underwear
- shorts
- 1-2 sweat shirts
- At least 1 pair pants
- socks
- Shoes for hiking
- hat
- pyjamas
- 1 light jacket
- shirts

Other stuff

- 1 Warm sleeping bag/ or blanket (REQUIRED)
- Small Pillow
- 1-2 rolls toilet paper (REQUIRED)
- Air Mattress (IF YOU DON'T HAVE ONE TALK TO JERID)
- Bible (REQUIRED)
- Pen/Pencil
- Sun screen
- Flashlight\batteries
- Watch
- Sunglasses (REQUIRED)
- 1 cup (REQUIRED)
- 1 plate (REQUIRED)
- 1 bowl (REQUIRED)
- 1 knife (REQUIRED)
- 1 fork (REQUIRED)
- 1 spoon (REQUIRED)
- towel
- Hygiene Items: dental floss; toothpaste; tooth brush, deodorant

Optional

- sandals
- cards
- games
- books
- Camera
- Fishing pole + gear (must abide by all Algonquin fishing rules)

DO NOT BRING

- knives that are not made for whittling
- radios or electronics (with exception of phone for rides there and back)
- Drugs (Other than necessary prescription)
- More than 1 bag

REMEMBER EVERYTHING YOU BRING MUST BE IN YOUR BAG. SLEEPING BAGS MAY BE TIED TO YOUR BAGS. PACK LIGHTLY

RULES

- 1. The leaders on the trip are the ones with authority. Listen to them.
- 2. No wandering off alone or with another student unless given permission by a leader.
- 3. No leaving food, snacks, toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant etc. or nice smelling items in the tent or campsite overnight.
- 4. NO spending time near or entering a tent that is used by those of the opposite gender.
- 5. No spending large amounts of time in any tent unless that time is designated by a leader (use it to change quickly, but nothing more).

CANOE RULES

- Canoes are not battering rams. Do not ram them into the shore. Ease them in.
- Everything in your boat should be tied to the gunnels, incase you flip. We do not want to lose any food.

- Each canoe is responsible for what is put in it by leaders when we arrive. DO NOT LEAVE STUFF BEHIND AT PORTAGES.
- Do not use paddles to slap water. We are not carrying many spares.
- Make sure a heaving line, whistle, and bailing bucket are in your canoe.
- If you are under 16 you must wear your life jacket.
- It is not a race, stay in the pack, besides you do not know where we are going.
- You should always be within sight of all other canoes.
- No fishing while we travel.

IN CASES WHERE THE LEADERSHIP FEELS THAT A CHILD MUST BE REMOVED, THEY WILL BE DRIVEN PADDLED AND DRIVEN HOME AT THE EXPENSE OF THE INDIVIDUAL. PARENTS WILL ALSO BE CONTACTED.
